The Famed McPherson Roundhouse



Home to the McPherson Bullpup varsity basketball teams for over **58** years, the first varsity basketball game was played in the famed facility on December 3, 1963. To this day, the Roundhouse continues to be the premier high school facility in the state of Kansas. One sports writer, upon visiting the Roundhouse for the first time, remarked, "This is like the Taj Mahal of high school arenas!"

With a current capacity listed as 2,700, the early years found that figure routinely exceeded for league, invitational tournament, regional and sub-state games, with fans at times standing two and three-deep around the concourse and students spilling out onto the floor surrounding the court.

In addition to its unique "roundhouse" design and its accompanying great atmosphere for basketball, the Roundhouse has been kind to the home team over the years. On their way to winning a combined 22 state basketball championships, both the Bullpup girls' and boys' teams have won over 82% of their games played on the hallowed hardwoods.

Over the years, various additions, replacements, and improvements have taken place. In 1983, a Bullpup head was added to the center jump circle. In January 1991, the Booster Club initiated and installed the first set of 16 banners above the court, recognizing State Championships won by MHS athletic teams and activities. Since that time, the number of State Championship banners has grown to **57**. The Wall of Fame plaques program was formalized in January 1994. Today, **226** plaques, honoring individual state champions, coaches, and contributors to MHS activities, line the walls and soon will encircle the Roundhouse concourse.

Other improvements to the Roundhouse have included new bleachers being installed in the summer of 2004. In the summer of 2006, the center court, suspended scoreboard was added and new lighting replaced the original "blue lights". The following summer (2007), the original floor was replaced with new hardwoods and a new paint scheme which included, for the first time, the free throw lanes and end lines painted solid red and the Bullpup logo in the center circle being replaced with a red "M". (The original center circle with the Bullpup logo was preserved and is on display on a wall at the McPherson Museum and Arts Foundation at 1111 E. Kansas Avenue.) In 2014, the lighted signage above the main entry into the Roundhouse, was added. Prior to the start of the 2019-20 season, a new media table, complete with an electronic message board, was placed on the opposite side of the floor from the scorer's table. This enhancement created more room for the media, and the message board provided an opportunity to display pertinent graphics, announcements, and advertising.


